**HUMAN PAPILLOMAVIRUS (HPV)** is a common virus that can infect teens and adults. It can cause a number of cancers, including:

- Cancers of the cervix, vagina and vulva in women
- Penile cancer in men
- Throat cancer

A vaccine to prevent certain types of these cancers is available for kids and young adults, but timing is important. Together with your parents, talk with your doctor to see how you can prevent HPV-related cancers by getting vaccinated.
